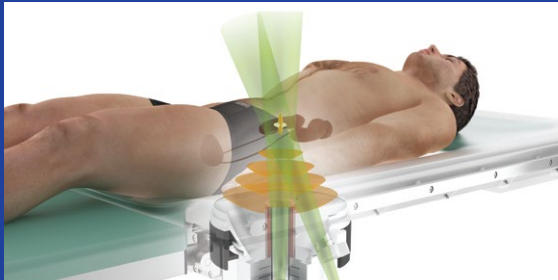


Non-invasive treatment

The mobile lithotripsy unit is a purpose-built mobile facility that offers nationwide access to non-invasive kidney stone treatment using a state-of-the-art lithotripter machine. The stone is targeted using x-ray or ultrasound and then the shockwave is focused onto this point. The lithotripter machine then sends focused shock waves through the body to break up the stone into tiny pieces, allowing them to be passed naturally.

We have been providing the mobile lithotripsy service for 30 years and have treated more than 16,000 patients.

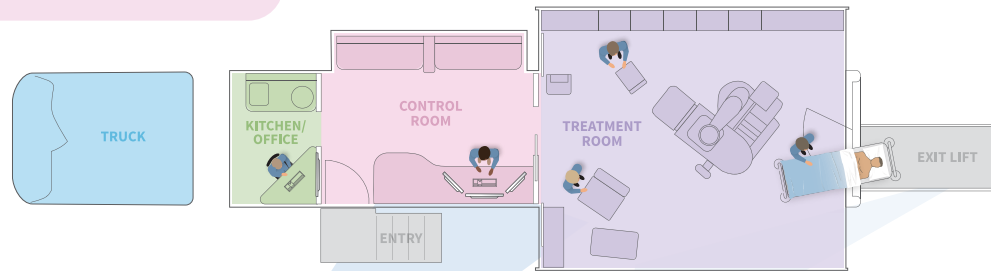


What we do

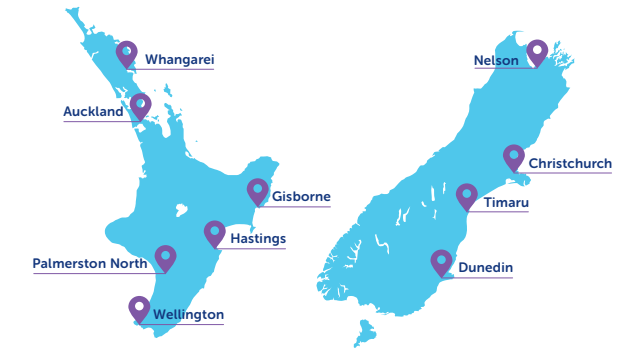
Our team

The lithotripter is operated by urologists who work alongside our specially trained Medical Imaging Technologists (MITs). Their role is to locate the stone and determine the number and intensity of shocks for the best outcome.

An anaesthetist oversees the sedation and anaesthesia, with additional support provided by a nurse and an anaesthetic technician.

Where we go

Our mobile unit travels regularly throughout Aotearoa New Zealand, linking providers to deliver cost-effective treatment close to home. This shared mobile service enables patients to receive care in their own region from their own urologist, fostering continuity and convenience in treatment.
